The first part of the book is devoted to a general survey of the history of the United States from the discovery of the continent to the present time.

The second part is devoted to a detailed account of the political and social conditions of the country during the same period.

The third part is devoted to a description of the geographical features of the United States, and to an account of the natural resources of the country.

The fourth part is devoted to a description of the climate of the United States, and to an account of the diseases which are prevalent in different parts of the country.

The fifth part is devoted to a description of the population of the United States, and to an account of the different races and nations which inhabit the country.

The sixth part is devoted to a description of the commerce of the United States, and to an account of the different branches of industry which are pursued in the country.

The seventh part is devoted to a description of the military and naval forces of the United States, and to an account of the different wars which have been waged by the country.

The eighth part is devoted to a description of the literature and arts of the United States, and to an account of the different sciences which are cultivated in the country.

The ninth part is devoted to a description of the government of the United States, and to an account of the different departments and offices which are established in the country.

The tenth part is devoted to a description of the constitution of the United States, and to an account of the different powers which are vested in the different branches of the government.

The eleventh part is devoted to a description of the laws of the United States, and to an account of the different courts which are established in the country.

The twelfth part is devoted to a description of the customs and manners of the United States, and to an account of the different habits and prejudices which are prevalent in the country.

The thirteenth part is devoted to a description of the religion of the United States, and to an account of the different sects and denominations which are established in the country.

The fourteenth part is devoted to a description of the education of the United States, and to an account of the different schools and colleges which are established in the country.

The fifteenth part is devoted to a description of the agriculture of the United States, and to an account of the different crops which are raised in the country.

The sixteenth part is devoted to a description of the manufactures of the United States, and to an account of the different articles which are produced in the country.

The seventeenth part is devoted to a description of the mining industry of the United States, and to an account of the different minerals which are discovered in the country.

The eighteenth part is devoted to a description of the fisheries of the United States, and to an account of the different kinds of fish which are caught in the country.

The nineteenth part is devoted to a description of the navigation of the United States, and to an account of the different ports and harbours which are situated in the country.
