contemplating the use of or are already using the coal stoking technology.

The Danish authorities of environment are specially aware of the change from fuel oil to coal-stoking.

However, we must state that by now the authorities have approved the coal fired district heating stations without intensifying the claims comparted to earlier. This is probably connected with the fact that coal-stoking according to the Danish legislation about heat

distribution is part of one of the means by which to reduce the Danish dependence of oil.

At the same time it appears from the Danish environment policy that because of pollution a change-over to the use of natural gas in the district heating stations is preferable.

Whether the extension of the coal fired district heating stations is to continue will presumably result in a political/economical decision at the end.
